### TRANSFER AGREEMENT FOR BACCALAUREATE DEGREE



## Southern Maine Community College & University of Maine Farmington



### Statement of Purpose

Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) and the University of Maine Farmington (UMF) have entered into this transfer articulation agreement. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from a two-year community college to the University of Maine Farmington. This agreement shall describe the required program of study at SMCC and the specific course equivalencies for the UMF Baccalaureate Degree Program indicated.

### **Terms & Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer**

To: BS Early Childhood Education, UMF Prek-Grade 3 Certification

From: AAS Early Childhood Education, SMCC

The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall be in compliance with state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned AAS Early Childhood Education degrees from Southern Maine Community College shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this agreement.

Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as UMF students. All applications accepted to UMF Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in the following pages.

### **APPENDIX A**

### Admission & Graduation Requirements of the Receiving Institution

This agreement includes specific requirements for admission into a program, outlines requirements, and indicates which degree or diploma can be used to meet program prerequisites as well as general education, major or program, and graduation requirements.

### **Admissions Requirements**

Students apply to the University of Maine Farmington. The application is also reviewed by the Early Childhood Education faculty. Requirements for admission to UMF include:

- a completed application form,
- an application fee (currently waived),
- · official transcripts from all colleges attended, and
- a personal statement.

#### Requirements for admission to the Early Childhood Education Program – Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 3 Certification:

- UMF admissions requirements listed above,
- · Recommendations in support of your interest in teaching,
- An essay that reflects your desire to teach at the appropriate age level and highlighting any relevant work experience, and
- Completion of UMF in-field disposition evaluation.

For coursework to transfer to UMF, a student must earn a grade of C- or better.

# Requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education Prek-Grade 3 Certification Track (See Appendix C)

Remaining required course work is listed in Appendix C; a complete list of required courses can be found here <a href="https://www.umf.maine.edu/academics/academic-catalogs/">https://www.umf.maine.edu/academics/academic-catalogs/</a>.

Students must have grades of B- or higher in all their professional education courses, with the possibility of one exemption for extenuating circumstances (although the student must earn a minimum grade of C- in that particular course), while attaining an accumulative GPA of 2.750 or higher to graduate. Practicum courses cannot be considered for this exemption.

### Residency Requirement

All students in baccalaureate degree programs must earn the following from the University of Maine at Farmington: 1) a minimum of 18 of the credits required by their major program(s) at the 200 level or above\*, and 2) a minimum of 30 of the total required credits.

\*An academic program may require that more than 18 credits of advanced coursework and/or specific coursework, such as a capstone course, be completed at UMF.

Note: A course grade of C- or higher is needed for a course to transfer to UMF. A grade of C or higher is needed for ENG 100, and after transfer, a grade of B- or higher is needed in all Early Childhood Education professional education courses to satisfy UMF's Early Childhood Education program requirements.

### General Education Requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education at UMF:

General education courses must total 40 credits in the following areas. Some of these course requirements can be satisfied through the general education courses taken as part of SMCC's AAS in Early Childhood Education. See the course equivalency data base on Mainestreet at <a href="https://mainestreet.maine.edu">https://mainestreet.maine.edu</a> to determine which SMCC courses will fulfill the UMF general education requirements:

- ENG 100;
- One intensive writing course;
- Two natural science courses, with a lab, in biology, chemistry, environmental science, geology or physics. Courses in two different science disciplines are required at UMF;
- Three social science courses. Courses in three different social science disciplines are required at UMF;
- One arts course in art, art history, dance, music, music history, or theater;
- One arts or humanities course in English literature, philosophy, religion, French, Spanish, Chinese or a diversity course;
- One health or physical education course (waived for transfers);
- One math course;
- One general Education Elective;
- General electives as needed to reach 40 credits in General Education.

### **Professional Education Requirements:**

### Candidacy

Students are eligible to apply for Candidacy upon the completion of Candidacy requirements. Applications for Candidacy are completed inTk20. Only students who have been approved for Candidacy are eligible to continue in their professional education program. Candidacy requirements are:

- Completion of the Candidacy application;
- Cumulative GPA of 2.750 or higher;
- Grade of B- or better in all professional education courses (A student may have one exemption, although the student must earn a grade of C- or higher in that particular course. Practicum courses are not eligible for exemption.);
- Grade of C or better in English 100 (AP credit is accepted, as is an equivalent English course transferred with a grade of C or higher.);
- Successful completion of practicum/practica with a grade of B- or higher;
- Successful completion of the Teacher Candidate Dispositions; and
- Professional Expectations Assessment

#### **UMF Graduation Credit Requirement:**

Minimum total credits needed for graduation from UMF – 120 credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
