TRANSFER AGREEMENT FOR BACCALAUREATE DEGREE

Kennebec Valley Community College & University of Maine Farmington

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from Kennebec Valley Community College (KVCC) to the University of Maine Farmington (UMF). It is recognized that this agreement shall describe the required program of study at KVCC for admission eligibility to University of Maine Farmington and the degree program indicated.

Terms & Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer

To: Bachelor of Science Elementary Education K-6, UMF From: Associate in Applied Arts Liberal Studies, KVCC

The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall be in compliance with state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned degrees from Kennebec Valley Community College shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this agreement.

Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as UMF students. All applicants accepted to University of Maine Farmington's Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in Appendices A, B & C.

<u>Articulation Implementation and Agreement Review</u>

The Chief Academic Officer designee of the collaborating institutions shall be responsible for implementing this agreement, for identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, and for conducting a periodic review of this agreement.

APPENDIX A

Admission & Graduation Requirements of the Receiving Institution

Admissions Requirements

Successful completion of the KVCC Associate in Applied Arts Liberal Studies, submission of a completed admission application, application fee (currently waived), official transcripts from all colleges attended, and other supporting materials. For coursework to transfer to UMF, a student must earn a grade of C- or better.

Requirements for admission to education programs (Elementary K-6, Secondary-Math, Science: Life or Physical, Social Studies, English):

- UMF admission requirements listed above
- An essay that reflects your desire to teach at the appropriate age level and highlighting any relevant work experience

Residency Requirement

All students in baccalaureate degree programs must earn the following from the University of Maine at Farmington:

- 1) a minimum of 18 of the credits required by their major program(s) at the 200 level or above*
- 2) a minimum of 30 of the total required credits
- *An academic program may require that more than 18 credits of advanced coursework and/or specific coursework, such as a capstone course, be completed at UMF.

The state of Maine also requires students certified in Elementary Education to have 6 credits of English, 6 credits of Science, 6 credits of Math, and 6 credits of Social Studies/Social Science (Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology).

General Education:

Students who complete their A.A. at KVCC may apply to have their transcript evaluated as part of the University of Maine System (UMS)-Maine Community College System (MCCS) General Education Block Transfer Agreement. Students who have completed the General Education Transfer Block at KVCC will be regarded as having completed the General Education requirements at UMF, except for up to 11 credits specified by the institution.

Students need to request block transfer upon their admission to UMF. Students should meet UMF Gen. Ed. requirements with the program listed. Transfers are exempt from First Year Seminar and Health/Physical Education courses if they are bringing in more than 60 credits.

Professional Education Requirements:

To enroll in professional education courses at the 300 level or above students must earn Candidacy in Education, which includes achieving some specific course grades (see note on page 3), completing all required practica with satisfactory professional dispositions, and having a 2.75 GPA overall in UMF courses.

Prior to Student Teaching and for teacher certification, students in the Elementary Education Program:

- a. complete all required UMF professional education courses with grades of B- or higher,
- b. achieve a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher, and
- c. be fingerprinted and have a Criminal History Record Check.

UMF Graduation Credit Requirement:

Total credits needed for graduation from UMF – 120 credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
